Coronavirus Update

Statement from Cardinal Thomas Collins, Archbishop of Toronto regarding Re-opening of Places of Worship – June 8, 2020

Premier Ford made an announcement regarding the re-opening of places of worship, in light of restrictions that have been in place for the last number of months relating to the coronavirus pandemic.

We thank Premier Ford and Minister Monte McNaughton (who coordinated and liaised with faith communities during this period of pandemic), for their efforts in recognizing the importance of places of worship for so many Ontarians. We also appreciate the opportunity for constructive dialogue over the last number of weeks regarding our concerns and suggestions for a path forward.

I am grateful to Catholics throughout the archdiocese for their patience and understanding as we worked collectively to minimize the potential spread of Covid-19 over the past several months. I am also keenly aware that closing our more than 200 Catholic churches in the Archdiocese of Toronto has been a painful and difficult period for all of us.

As announced by Premier Ford, there will be capacity restrictions (30%) as we move to an initial phase of re-opening our churches. We will also be employing measures to ensure the safety of all those who worship at Catholic churches throughout the archdiocese. Our full re-opening plan and timing of its implementation will be issued publicly later this week after we have the opportunity to consult our Council of Priests and provide in-service sessions for clergy and staff.

We very much look forward to returning to the celebration of the sacraments in our churches as we continue to pray for all those who are sick, those who have died and for all those front-line workers who are serving so faithfully.

With the direction from Cardinal Thomas Collins, Archdiocese of Toronto, (<https://www.archtoronto.org/media-centre/news-archive/chancery-news/Timeline-for-Re-opening-Churches-in-the-Archdiocese-of-Toronto>) we are pleased to announce the gradual re-opening of St. Anthony of Padua Parish.

Please note that as per government direction regarding capacity, churches are limited to **30%** of our worship space (240 persons inside our church).

Masks are highly recommended but not mandatory. Social distancing by 2 metres (6 feet) will be required.

There is **NO reservation procedures** for any Mass.

First come, first serve.

June 12 & 13, 2020 – preparation for parishes. Churches remain closed.

Sunday, June 14, 2020 – **8:30am – 2pm** On the feast of Corpus Cristi, we are open for private prayer and Adoration only.

Mon, June 15, 2020 – Church will be open for private prayer only.

Tue, June 16, 2020 – Church will be open for private prayer & Adoration

Wed, June 17, 2020 – 9:00a.m. daily Masses begin for the public. Masks are highly recommended, social distancing is required, and no singing from congregation.

Please note the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus June 19 and the Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary June 20.

Weekend of June 20/21, 2020 – weekend Masses will resume as per usual Mass times. Masks are highly recommended, social distancing is required, and no singing from congregation.

If you have a fever and/or are feeling sick, please do not attend church.

During this transition period, dispensation from the Sunday Mass will continue for those who may not be able to attend for health reasons or due to capacity restrictions.

During transition, Fr. Joseph Pham will continue with Sunday Mass on [St. Anthony of Padua YouTube channel](#) for those who are unable to attend church.
