A note from our Pastor

My dear parishioners,
As of the latest by-law announced on the 19 September, churches can still remain at 30% capacity. That means that St. Anthony's may hold up to 230 people at a time. Masks or face coverings are requested when inside the church.

We have a reservation process for anyone who would prefer to reserve your space for Sunday Mass. You DO NOT have to reserve. It is not a must. But if you prefer to reserve for Sundays, simply phone the church office for a reservation number.

If you like, you may choose to come as first come, first serve and you might need to be in line.

Please note that Weekday Masses are all first come, first serve. You are encouraged to self-regulate while attending. Also, you may wish to create your own personal log when attending church.
